

KNOCKHILL GOING GREEN WITH SUSTAINABILITY PROJECTS

DID YOU KNOW?...

- Knockhill Racing Circuit formed a partnership with CATACLEAN, one of the leading manufacturers of environmental automotive products for all our track and road cars.
- All electricity consumed is 100% UK generated renewable electricity and all waste is separated and recycled with waste tyres shredded and recycled.
- Base energy requirements for electric are now self generated on site through the installation of of solar panels covering much of the roof of the pit lane garages.
- Knockhill has engaged with the Forestry Commission since 1983 with a tree planting programme which continued recently in 2021 and 2022 by former British Touring Car Championship driver Rory Butcher.
- All buildings are fueled by LPG as are all the Kart Centre adult and junior karts.

 Knockhill Motor Sports Club changed its Super Lap Scotland regulations to allow electric cars to compete.
- Knockhill was one of the first companies in Scotland to have a car charging point which is available to all visitors and 50% of the management team drive electric road cars.
- In 2025, the International McRae Rally Challenge was 200% offset all competitor emissions with Carbon Positive Motorsport.
- In 2024, the KMSC Scottish Legends competitor emissions were 200%, in 2025, the ModSports were off-set and in 2026, Super Lap Scoltand competitors emmisions will be off-set, making the KSMC one of the first Clubs in the world to have all it's championships off-set.
- Knockhill achieved Motorsport UK accreditation for their sustainability projects, measures and working practices one of the first Clubs in the UK.
- Recycling Zones were introduced at the Superbike and Touring Car events with signage and maps to encourage fans to recycle responsibly. This will be expanded in 2026 to have a venue-wide plan for efficient waste collection.
